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From the Director...

Let summer begin! With summer and warmer temperatures come fun activities including water days, picnics and movies.

Once a week, each class will play outside in the water with sprinklers, water tables, spray bottles, sponges, just to name a few. To keep the water days exciting, the teachers plan to add different activities each week. For example, one week the water activities may focus on bubbles and another week may include fun in the mud. The one requirement for water days are water/swim shoes. For safety reasons, the children must be wearing water shoes that will stay on while participating in the activities or they will not be allowed to participate. Flip flops are not an acceptable water shoe because they do not stay on and do not provide protection for feet. The teachers will let you know if there is anything else your child needs to bring, so please watch for information on daily sheets or notes in mailboxes.

What is summer without picnics! Each class is scheduled for a picnic once a month. The insect and bird wings will picnic at the center on the patio. The sea wing and rainforest wing will walk across the street to the playground behind the Garden Apartments for their picnic. Because the older classrooms will be leaving center property, parents will be notified and be required to sign a field trip permission slip. Parents are welcome to bring a lunch and join their child's classroom for the picnic.

Other activities include movies once a month for the Robins, Hummingbirds, Sea and Rainforest Wing. All classes will have physical education on Monday and Wednesday and music will continue on Friday as usual. Please note all activities and times on schedules made available in your child's classroom.

As summer approaches, we want to wish you a happy and cool summer season!

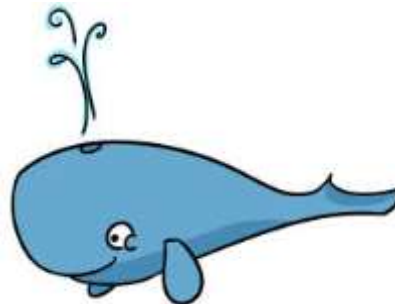

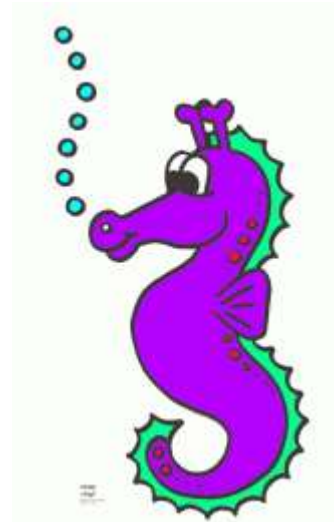
